#### Hats are back!

As the UV rating is now consistently 3 or above, please make sure that students have their hat in their bag everyday.

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#### Sunsmart

A reminder that as the UV levels increase at this time of year, we need to be sunsmart! The Cancer Council recommend a combination of sun protection measures:

**1.** Slip on some sun-protective clothing that covers as much skin as possible.

2. Slop on broad spectrum, water resistant SPF30+ (or higher) sunscreen. Put it on 20 minutes before you go outdoors and every two hours afterwards. Sunscreen should never be used to extend the time you spend in the sun.

**3.** Slap on a hat – broad brim or legionnaire style to protect your face, head, neck and ears.

4. Seek shade.

**5.** Slide on some sunglasses – make sure they meet Australian Standards.

Our Sun Smart Policy specifies that all students must wear a sun smart hat whenever they are outdoors at school once the UV reaches 3. Currently, the UV rating is above 3, **so please ensure students have a sunsmart hat everyday at school.** Students without hats will be directed to stay in shaded areas.

As a completion to our Inquiry Geography unit we are completing posters on a country of our choice including features such as population, capital city, languages, flora and fauna found there.





#### From Year 4/5



#### Whooping Cough

Whooping cough

Whooping cough cases are continuing to increase across Victoria, particularly among school-aged children. Whooping cough is a very contagious infection, mostly spread through coughing or sneezing. Symptoms include:

- · blocked or runny nose
- tiredness
- $\cdot$  mild fever

 $\cdot$  severe bouts of coughing, often followed by a 'whooping' sound on breathing.

Whooping cough can lead to life threatening infections in babies. If your child is unwell, they should not attend school. Please see a doctor if you or your child develops whooping cough symptoms. Early diagnosis and treatment will help reduce the spread of the infection.

Students diagnosed with whooping cough must not attend school [Primary schools only – delete if you are a secondary school:] If your child is diagnosed with whooping cough, they must not attend school for 21 days after the onset of the cough, or until they have received 5 days of antibiotic treatment. You must notify the school if your child is diagnosed with whooping cough. To further reduce the spread of infection to your child and the school community, the Public Health and Wellbeing Regulations 2019 require that some students who were in the same classroom as a student diagnosed with whooping cough should not attend school.

Your child should not attend school for 14 days after they were last exposed to a person diagnosed with whooping cough, or until they have taken 5 days of a course of antibiotic treatment if they are:

· aged less than 7 years; and

• not fully vaccinated with 3 doses of whooping cough (pertussis) vaccine. This exclusion is required by law – refer to the School exclusion table for primary schools and children's services.

If your child is diagnosed with whooping cough, please contact the school to let us know.
