The Victorian Government is delivering the School Saving Bonus – a oneoff \$400 support for government school students from Prep to Year 12 in
2025.

From Tuesday 26 November 2024, you will receive an email from the Department of Education with your unique \$400 School Saving Bonus code.

The School Saving Bonus will help families cover the cost of uniforms, textbooks, excursions, activities and more.

If you have multiple children enrolled in Victorian government schools for 2025, you will receive one School Saving Bonus code email per child. These emails might arrive on different days. Please make sure to check your spam/junk email folder.

Parents and carers can use the School Saving Bonus code in store at school-nominated suppliers. Parents and carers can also choose to access the School Saving Bonus online system, where they can allocate part or all the \$400 bonus to use at school nominated-online suppliers or for school activities.






From Year 3

In Grade 3 we have been working on speeches in our Writing sessions. The children have chosen a topic they are interested in or a persuasive argument that they feel strongly about. We have drafted these speeches and practised in front of a partner to check for speed, eye contact and expression. In Reading we have focussed on finding text to text and text to self connections in books we have read, where the characters experience a similar event in two different texts.

For Maths we have finished our unit on Fractions, where we looked at showing and recognising simple fractions. We also did some revision of our Area/Perimeter unit using regular shapes such as a rectangle and square in our calculations. For Inquiry unit we have started working on a speech as the culmination of our learning in our Cultural Diversity unit. The children are working in partners or individually and researching about a chosen country and the culture, traditions, festivals and celebrations common to their particular country.







The 4/5 class are working on 'Area' in Maths. Students have been challenged to work out different letters of the alphabet that have an area of 6cm sq.


We have also engaged in some digital area activities, building different areas and

Ice to Liquid Experiment

One random day we had a question. If we froze ice for longer than another piece, would it melt slower?

We spoke to Scott about it to see if we could try it. We thought if we froze water for a longer, it would melt slower than a piece of ice that's been frozen for less time. We thought of a date to start the experiment.

On 15/10 we went to the kitchen and got set up. We used a paper cup and a marker. We wrote the date and how many millilitres we used on the cup. We then filled it up with 40mL of water and put it in the freezer.

It was supposed to be in the freezer for 1 week but then we forgot about it and it ended up being in there for about a month. We went back to the kitchen two weeks later and we did the same thing, filled it up to 40mL and wrote the date. But we ended up realising that it was only supposed to be in there for a day and the next day Scott was too busy to do the time-lapse so we left it for two weeks instead. On 13/11 we put another cup in the freezer but for actually one day this time. On 14/11 we set up the iPad for the time-lapse and took the ice out the freezer.

We took them out of the cups and placed them on the bottom of a plastic cups upside down. We started the time-lapse and waited. It took about four hours to melt.







When it was fully melted we checked the footage and it turned out that the one that's been frozen for 1 day melted slightly slower and the one that's been frozen for longer. The one that's been frozen for two weeks melted just a bit after the one day ice. And the one that's been frozen for one month melted slightly faster.

We think that they melted at slightly different rates because we had ice blocks that were slightly different sizes (+/- 2ml).

We learnt that it doesn't really matter how long the ice is frozen for, it will melt at about the same rate.


