-An enhanced and engaging STEM program (Science, Technology, Engineering & Maths) with the substantial purchase of STEM resources such as robotics


- Continuation of our Extension Program, as well as support and intervention

### Why Mindset Matters?



In the first few weeks of school, APPS delivers a Quality Start-Up program across the school. This gives the students an opportunity to get to know each other, as well as a voice in classroom rules, general wellbeing and learning strategies, and we also talk about the impact of your own self-talk or mindset on learning. When we have a fixed mindset, the way we perceive ourselves is that we may never overcome a challenge "I can't do it". This may cause students to give up trying to master a new skill. If we have a growth mindset, we can add a very important word to that sentence: "I can't do it - yet". Learning can sometimes be challenging, but we encourage our students not to give up, and to have a growth mindset.

This important learning is continued in our dedicated Wellbeing session every week by our amazing Wellbeing teacher, Sophie.

Thanks goes to Elicia, who created this wonderful corridor display, to remind us all to never give up, even if something is difficult.

### Summer break building project

You may have noticed over the holidays that there were (unusually) a lot of people onsite. This was to complete major building renovations to our school. ### **Every Day Counts!**

Schooling is compulsory for children and young people aged from 6 to 17 years unless an exemption from attendance or enrolment has been granted.

Daily school attendance is important for all children and young people to succeed in education and to ensure they don't fall behind both socially and developmentally. Children and young people who regularly attend school and complete Year 12 or an equivalent qualification have better health outcomes, better employment outcomes, and higher incomes across their lives. It is important that children develop habits of regular attendance at an early age.

School participation is important as it maximises life opportunities for children and young people by providing them with education and support networks. School helps people to develop important skills, knowledge and values which set them up for further learning and participation in their community.

Conversely, limited school participation is associated with a greater chance of dropping out of school, disruptive and delinquent behaviour and may lead to a cycle of rebellion against authority.

Students are expected to attend the school in which they are enrolled, during normal school hours every day of each term, unless:

- there is an approved exemption from school attendance for the student, or
- the student is registered for home schooling and has only a partial enrolment in a school for particular activities

Here at APPS, we work alongside families to maximise student attendance for every child, as we know how important it is for children to be at school everyday. If you have any questions about support, please email Jane.Capon@education.vic.gov.au

Mobile Phones, Smart watches, personal iPads, etc.

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School Saving Bonus reminder and support

The Victorian Government is delivering the School Saving Bonus (SSB) – a oneoff support of \$400 for eligible government school students from Prep to Year 12 in 2025.

The SSB helps families cover the cost of uniforms, textbooks, excursions, activities and more.

Most families have now received their SSB code(s). To learn more about the SSB online system, download the stepby-step System guide for parents and carers (DOCX, 945KB) or watch the School Saving Bonus video. System guide translations are also available in 14 languages.

If you would like to use your bonus for school activities, you can allocate some or all of the bonus using the School Saving Bonus online system.

If you have only recently completed your enrolment into the Victorian government school system you can expect to receive your SSB code(s) in the coming weeks.

If you have transferred to our school from another Victorian government school, any remaining funds on your SSB code(s) will soon be available to use at our approved school suppliers. We request your patience as this change is processed. The Department of Education has established a dedicated contact centre to support the SSB. The contact centre can be reached by:
