Mental Health in Primary Schools



Hi all, my name is Wendy Phillips. Many of you already know me as I have worked here at APPS for almost 10 years in various roles. This year, as part of the Mental Health in Primary Schools (MHiPS) initiative, I have taken on the role of Mental Health and Wellbeing Leader (MHWL). I will continue to work in a part-time capacity as Assistant Principal and Learning Specialist as well! This year my working days are typically Monday to Thursday.

The MHiPS initiative is a product of Victoria's Royal Commission into Mental Health. The program began in 2020, is being rolled out this year in our region, and by next year, most Victorian primary schools will have a Mental Health & Wellbeing Leader.

My role includes promoting wellbeing and supporting positive mental health in the school community. I will be working with staff, students, families and external providers to enhance the existing wellbeing already embedded at APPS, strengthen community connections and provide clear pathways of referral for those requiring extra support...it is not a counselling service! I will also be working alongside Chantal (School Wide Positive Behaviours), Damon (Student Voice and Engagement) and Tal (School

Counsellor), to maximise student engagement, develop positive relationships and encourage thriving learning environments.

Going forward I will be including a Wellbeing section in each newsletter with different resources available to support our community both inside and outside of school.




What a Legend!

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS)

Students at APPS are very familiar with School **Values** Respect, our Responsibility and Resilience. Students are explicitly taught what behaviours we see when we are being respectful, **Teachers** responsible and resilient. provide students tokens to acknowledge them when thev are displaying our values. This is part of our School Wide Positive Behaviour Support program, recommended by Department of Education. Students can then use their tokens at the token shop and to vote on a whole school reward. Currently, it looks like the Free Dress day is out in front!

In Literacy, our Foundation students have now learnt all of the stage one letters and sounds! This means that they have learnt enough sounds to start reading the stage one decodable readers. We are very proud of the achievements of all of our students.

In Maths, after spending the beginning weeks of term on number and place value, we are now turning our attention to measurement. This week we began our exploration of measurement by collecting leaves from the garden and ordering them by size. We had a lengthy discussion about different types of measurement and how we use it in our everyday lives.








From 1/2A

At the beginning of each maths topic, we anchor ourselves with real life examples. It reminds us that maths is a vital part of life that we rely on well beyond the classroom.

Our 1-2 class shared so many great examples of ways in which they have used measurement in their lives and were also able to identify the importance of measuring in their parents' working lives.

We continued our recount study this week in Literacy as we read and enjoyed 'Possum Goes To School'. We made connections, compared and contrasted settings and described the characteristics of the possum, the main protagonist/antagonist.

We can't believe it's already Week 7! At this busy time of year, it's important to take time each morning to get together as a group by starting the day with a positive mindset. In 3/4A we do this using 'Positive Primers', where students come together to play a quick team building game, observe a beautiful scene from nature, or participate in a fast-paced fun activity. We have included a few examples for you to check out. These quick exercises allow us to build a sense of belonging and engagement with one another, and to help regulate our emotions to get ready to learn (and teach). Positive Primers are one of Berry Street's recommended strategies to foster a culture of wellbeing in classrooms. We also really love doing it, both teachers and students alike!

Wellbeing is never more important than during busy periods, such as getting the Year 3s for NAPLAN. We have been focusing on lots of explicit teaching in English by consolidating our writing skills by looking at the features and structure of narrative texts, using interesting words, and building more complicated sentences. Year 4s have been extending their written work using the 'Bump it Up' strategy to move their work from good, to great, to fantastic!

Please also remember next week is Cultural Diversity Week, which runs from Monday 17 March to Sunday 23 March. This year's theme is Embrace the journey – shape our future. We will be engaging in a range of activities based on cultural traditions and customs from around the world, and celebrating the things that make us all unique, but also bring us together as one! The week will culminate with Harmony Day on Friday 21st March with students being invited to wear traditional clothing associated with their cultural heritage, or orange, which is the Harmony Day theme colour! Have a wonderful weekend!














From 6A


We didn't win many games, but we had fun and showed great sportsmanship and our school values.


