Our Foundation and Year 1 & 2 students have been looking forward to their Teddy Bear's picnic today. Students (and their teddies) had a lovely picnic!






Works of Art

Ringwood Fire Station Visits

This fortnight, we had the opportunity to host two exciting and informative fire safety sessions from Ringwood Fire Station, offering both informative and hands-on experiences for the F-2 students.

First Visit: Fire Safety and Gear

The first visit focused on fire safety basics, with firefighters showing their full gear—jackets, helmets, and air tanks. They shared essential safety tips like checking smoke alarms, having an escape plan, never being near fire unsupervised. Students were able to ask questions and learn key ways to stay safe.

Second Visit: Firetruck and Hoses

The second visit brought the firetruck to our doorstep! Firefighters demonstrated how they use hoses to control water pressure and put out fires. Students explored the truck, see the equipment up close, and even sit inside for photos.

A big thank you to Ringwood Fire Station for these valuable, hands-on sessions! We're grateful for their time and expertise in keeping our community safe.

The visit also includes and complements many parts the Victorian Curriculum, including: STEM, English and Geography











From 4/5A




Laptops!




